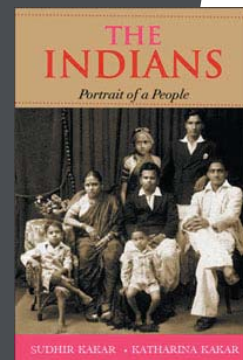
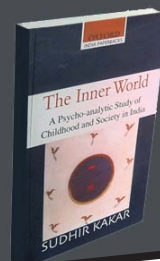
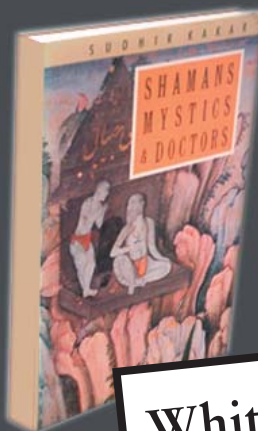


SUDHIR KAKAR
